How We're Amplifying Your Voices

The Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce hosted a discussion with federal Natural Resources Minister Johnathan Wilkinson on August 8 regarding Canada's clean energy future. In response to questions, Minister Wilkinson highlighted the important role Manitoba will play in mining, cleantech, and Indigenous-led development.

The Manitoba government is partnering with The Winnipeg Chamber of Commerce to provide more than \$1 million for a child-care pilot project that will help newcomers overcome the barrier of finding reliable child care. The project is part of The Chamber's Commitment to Opportunity, Diversity and Equity (CODE). The online platform facilitates long-lasting connections between employers and newcomer jobseekers, with the support of newcomer service agencies.

The Manitoba government announced their intention to increase the minimum wage on October 1, 2022 from \$11.95 / hour to \$13.50, and that it will rise to \$15.00 / hour by October 2023. This increase will be difficult for many businesses to manage, particularly in the hospitality and retail sectors. The government requested feedback through a consultation process and The Winnipeg Chamber will be at the forefront of making sure that its members are heard.

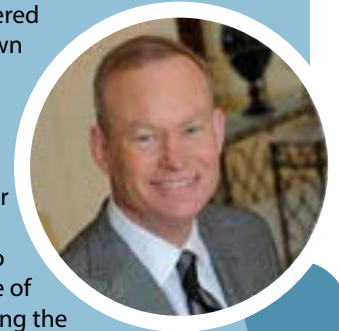
The Winnipeg Chamber released its 2022 Performance Playbook for the City of Winnipeg in early August, accompanied by an op-ed in the Winnipeg Free Press. The Playbook identifies five strategic goals and 28 recommendations and was sent to all mayoral and council candidates. The Chamber is meeting with mayoral candidates and is posting content so members can make an informed decision. The date of the mayoral debate is set for Friday, October 21, 2022 and will feature the leading candidates, according to independent polls.

Most FAQ:

**Q: What is a banner image?
What is the profile image?
It doesn't fit!**

A: We recommend using your business logo as the profile image and a high quality photo that captures the essence of your business for your banner image. After uploading the images, you can resize it to fit the frame by zooming in or out using your scroll wheel. You can also resize the image by using your preferred photo editing software. For reference the dimensions of the profile photo is 1:1 ratio, 1080 x 1080 px and the banner photo is 16:9 ratio, 1920 x 1080 px.
